

PROGRAM: Katie Peck told us about the TIG (Trauma, Illness and Grief) program at Midlakes. The goal of TIG is to prepare school districts to have appropriate support in place when they must respond to events involving trauma, violence, illness and death, which unfortunately our district has experienced in recent years. During times of a district—wide or school-wide crisis, school districts can deploy responders from both within and outside of the school in a coordinated and systematic manner. TIG is a consortium of school districts that provides shared training and back-up support networks in the event of a district-wide emergency. TIG teams from multiple districts that share a philosophy of crisis re-



sponse come together to help each other in times of crises Regrettably, crises are inevitable and schools must be prepared to deal with the unexpected. Thankfully we have such a program that provides tremendous support in these very difficult times.
